

# RFGH Community Health Improvement Plan 2025 - 2028



### Priority Area: Chronic Conditions

**Definition**: Persistent symptoms or diseases that are long-lasting in their effects and limits a person's quality of life.

- 12.5% of people living in Somerset County have a diagnosis of type 2 diabetes.
- 40.8% of people living in Somerset County have high cholesterol.
- 42.7% of people living in Somerset County have high blood pressure.
- 36.4% of adults living in Somerset County have arthritis.
- 37.8% of adults and 21.6% of high school students living in Somerset County are considered obese.

### Priority Area: Mental Health

**Definition**: Improving people's psychological or emotional well-being, through empowering them to cope with the stresses of life, realize their abilities, learn well and work well.

- 13% of adults living in Somerset County have current symptoms of depression.
- 24.7% of adults living in Somerset County have experienced anxiety in their lifetime.
- In 2024, there were 198,568 people for every 1 psychiatric provider.

### Priority Area: Preventive Care and Screening

**Definition**: Bringing healthcare such as tests and exams to people early on to identify potential health problems before symptoms appear, allowing for timely intervention and prevention of serious diseases.

- In 2024, there were 1,143 people for every 1 primary care physician.
- Transportation and primary care provider availability are major factors in Somerset County residents not accessing preventive care.

## Priority Area: Substance Use Disorder

**Definition**: The continued use of drugs and alcohol, despite that use causes harm to oneself and others.

- In 2023, there were 51 overdose deaths to every 100,000 people in Somerset County.
- In 2023, 2.9% of Maine high school students had used illicit drugs at some point in their lifetime.
