

THEME SCRIPTURE: "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time." 1 Timothy 2:3-6 (ESV)

We are all searching for something. Some search for meaning, others for peace, love, or purpose. Many try to fill the void with success, relationships, or pleasures only to realize that nothing truly satisfies them. But the answer to every longing has always been the same since the beginning: Jesus Christ. The gospel is not just for some people, in some places, or for some struggles. It is *For All*.

Jesus' grace is not limited to a person's background, certain sins, particular needs, or even time. His grace is wide enough to cover every failure. His provisions are deep enough to meet every need, and His truth is strong enough to last *For All* time. Whether you feel unworthy of forgiveness or unsure where to turn, the Good News remains unchanged! It is for you, the person next to you, the person across the world, and even for the person you least expect.

But knowing this truth is not enough. We must respond to it! If the gospel is *For All* then it must be central to how we live. We must embrace it fully, share it boldly, and trust it completely. The gospel is not just for a moment; it is for every breath, every step, and every generation. The gospel is the greatest gift, and it is *For All*.

SESSION 1: FOR ALL PEOPLE

- WHAT WE WANT STUDENTS TO LEARN: The gospel is for everyone, regardless of background, past mistakes, or social status.
- **SCRIPTURE**: Acts 10:34-35, Matthew 28:19-20, Galatians 3:28
- **SESSION SNAPSHOT:** Every culture, every nation, and every generation has sought truth, purpose, and salvation in some way, but only one message has remained unshaken the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is not bound by borders, traditions, or status; it is *For All* people, in all places, *For All* time. No one is too far broken or too lost for the love of Christ to reach them.

SESSION 2: FOR ALL YOUR SIN

- WHAT WE WANT STUDENTS TO LEARN: That no sin is too great for the grace of God.
- **SCRIPTURE:** Romans 3:21-23, Isaiah 1:18, Colossians 2:13-14, Hebrews 10:11-18
- **SESSION SNAPSHOT:** Sin weighs heavy on every heart, but no burden is too great for the Cross of Christ. God's grace does not offer partial forgiveness; it offers complete freedom. If the blood of Jesus is enough to remove every sin, then we must stop living as though some things are still unforgivable and step fully into the freedom He has already given us.

SESSION 3: FOR ALL YOUR NEEDS

- WHAT WE WANT STUDENTS TO LEARN: Jesus is not just our Savior. He is also our Provider.
- **SCRIPTURE:** Matthew 6:31-33, John 6:35, 2 Corinthians 9:8, Psalm 23:1
- **SESSION SNAPSHOT:** The world constantly tells us that we don't have enough, but Jesus is always enough. He does not just offer freedom! He sustains us, provides for us, and meets every need we have. If Christ is truly enough, we must live like it, trusting Him not only for our salvation but for the peace, purpose, and strength we search for daily.

SESSION 4: FOR NOW AND FOR ALL TIME

- WHAT WE WANT STUDENTS TO LEARN: The gospel is not just for this life; it is for all eternity
- **SCRIPTURE:** Hebrews 7:26-27, Isaiah 40:8, John 5:24, Romans 6:10,23
- **SESSION SNAPSHOT:** Everything in this world fades. Trends, relationships, and even our own lives, but the gospel never will. The gospel of Jesus is not just for a moment but for all time. His love does not run out, His promises do not expire, and His salvation does not have an end date. We must live with an eternal mindset, holding onto the hope that Jesus is not just for now; He is *For All*, forever.
